Mike, K9VF is one of a handful of our ARES members who were raised outside of the United States. He grew up in Barcelona, Spain and is fluent in Spanish and a local dialect, Catalan. Barcelona, the cosmopolitan capital of Spain's Catalonia region, is known for its art and architecture. Growing up included some favorite family hiking outings in the Pyrenees, a mountain range straddling the border of France and Spain. Hobbies include going on hikes or bike rides to discover new places, tinker with electronics and software and taking to the skies with aviation and flying.



College took Mike to Manchester, England to study at Salford University, majoring in Aeronautical Engineering. But his career quickly took him down the path towards electronics, software, and radio/wireless communications, and it has been the center of many different jobs and projects since then.

Since 1993, Mike has been involved with emergency services in one way or another. He started by joining the local volunteer Mountain Rescue team in the Peak District (UK), and then became a volunteer firefighter in Barcelona, which he did for 23 years. For his professional side, Mike has worked for several public safety organizations, including the fire service. The experience Mike gained working for the fire department's radio communications unit included a lot of handson practical experience with e.g. building RF cables with many different connector types, electrical work, installing radio & comms equipment in various vehicles. This month I'll be revisiting the ARRL website, sort of, to call attention to their newest service for all of us perpetual students. And I've thrown in an extra resource for the Elmers and facilitators among us, considering Santa Cruz ARES' renewed interest in working with CERT and neighborhood groups.

The Learning Center

Reading over a backlog of ARRL newsletters, I was reminded of the new learning opportunities being offered by ARRL. Always on the lookout for this kind of thing, I checked it out.

The offerings are grouped under a new service found under ARRL's umbrella, called The Learning Center. Technically, it isn't officially on ARRL's webit by logging in and making a few mouse-clicks. Once you've steered your way through the not-so-clear pathway to the access portal, you'll find yourself with a choice of study courses, activities and video tutorials. It takes a few steps to initially access The Learning Center. Start by visiting www.arrl.org and clicking on Licensing, Education, and Training. Scroll down to Popular Education Links and select Learning Center. Note that you'll need to create new login credentials to access the platform directly since it operates separately from ARRL's main website.

Once your login is registered, you'll find a variety of courses and podcasts tailored to different interests. You'll only see a few offerings at first; but click "view all" and it will reveal several pages of courses and podcasts to choose from. You can also use filters under the Browse button to explore topics such as education, electronics, emergency communications, podcasts, and webinars. Click on a course to view detailed information about its content. To enroll in a course, click the registration link at the top of its page. You can tackle a course or webinar at your own pace. If you leave off in the middle, returning to the portal is straightforward. Visit https://learn.arrl.org. You'll find a new section on the page, tracking your progress in selectsite, but you can find your way to ed courses. This feature ensures you can easily pick up where you left off.

CERT Radio Response Guide

One of our planned agenda items for Wednesday's ARES meeting will be discussion about working with Santa Cruz County Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT). This prompted me to do a little digging around the internet for similar partnerships, and I stumbled across this gem. For the instructors and planners among us, the CERT Radio Response Guide, developed by Eugene, Oregon's CERT community, could serve as a template for planning our own joint ventures, offering detailed instructions on pre-disaster preparations, field communication protocols, and essential tools for radio operators. Key sections of the guide include creating personal Radio Response Go-Kits, setting up Incident Command Posts (ICPs), and maintaining communication readiness. It also provides practical resources such as checklists, maps, and ICS forms to streamline operations during emergencies. We can use this document to model our own project materials, ranging from CERT-ARES field guides to instructions for neighborhood MURS operations. The creators expressed willingness to share, saying some of their own material was borrowed from other CERT groups, so borrowing bits and tailoring for our own guides shouldn't be a problem.
